Trappe Council Meeting Summary of Actions Taken July 3, 2018

- Council adopted Ordinance 445, which permits municipal use in the R-1 Residential District and thereby allow Trappe to address a long-standing road salt storage deficiency.
- A tentative Water Service Agreement was released to Ursinus College to allow the drilling of a well at Rt. 113 and College Ave. to support the irrigation needs of the Whittaker Environmental Research Station in Trappe.
- Ramoco Fuels presented plans and answered questions about their desire to upgrade the former Getty station on W. Main to sell gas and prepared foods. No building additions are planned, but the structure will be brought up to Gulf standards.
- The Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs recognized Cathy Johnson for her ten years of service to the Borough, the Borough Facebook page maintained by Pat Webster, and the 2017 Trappe 300th Anniversary Calendar issued by the Trappe 300 Committee.
- Council awarded a \$35,250 competitively bid contract to Ply-Mar Construction Co. Inc. to replace a deteriorated stormwater drainpipe on Marian Road.
- The Borough Engineer was authorized to review Borough roads to determine if roads other than W. 1st Ave. should be scheduled for repair and resurfacing in 2019 based on their comparative condition and the lack of certainty that the W. 1st Ave construction work would be completed early enough in 2019 to allow for its repaving.
- A contract for up to \$2,000 was approved for Innovative Construction Services to cover the erroneous double yellow line on Williams Way while they are mobilized in Trappe.
- Council approved up to \$3,600 for a survey and sketch plan to address stormwater issues on Center Ave.
- Council authorized both the replacement of the no parking signs on the south side of E. First Ave., and the preparation and release of bid documents for the repaving of E. First Ave. between W. Main St. and College Ave.
