**ORDINANCE NO. 438**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE  
BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF TRAPPE TO  
PERMIT THE TAX COLLECTOR TO ROUND REAL  
ESTATE TAX BILLS**

Be it **ORDAINED** and **ENACTED** by the Borough Council, Borough of Trappe, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by the authority of same as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 90, Article II of the Trappe Borough Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding Section 90-6 as follows:

**§90-6 Rounding Real Estate Bill**

Effective for the Trappe Borough real estate bills issued on or after January 1, 2017, the Tax Collector shall be permitted to round real estate tax bills to the extent that the Tax Collector is permitted to round the Montgomery County real estate tax bills.

**SECTION 2. Severability**

The provisions of this Ordinance are intended to be severable, and if any section, sentence, clause, part or provision hereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision of the Court shall not affect or impair the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, parts or provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted

even if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, sentence, clause, part or provision had not been included herein.

**SECTION 3. Repealer**

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances and any resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4. Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval as required by the law.
