In 2016 Joan Dr., Linden St. and a portion of Linden Dr. will be resurfaced. Also, seal coating will be applied to the parking lots at Borough Hall and Rambo Park.

The repaving plan for Borough Line Rd. from West 7th Ave to N. Borough Line Rd has slipped into 2017 due to a delay in an Upper Providence sanitary sewer line installation. Also in 2017, we plan to repave Clahor Ave. from 3rd Ave. to Zvarick Rd. As part of this project, we are investigating both improving the drainage and increasing the turning radius at 3rd Ave. Perkiomen Township and Trappe are planning to repave Betcher Rd. after our Public Works Department enhances the reliability of our water system by installing a back-up water line from 3rd Ave. to the intersection of Betcher Rd. and Nicholas Dr.

Upper Providence Township and Trappe are seeking PennDOT input on the possibility of having shoulders painted on Main Street. This would enhance the safety of bicyclists who use the road and make our communities more bicycle friendly. Please contact our borough manager to provide your input on this idea.
